Teachers

- Will receive an average raise of \$5,151 (HB 530)
- May receive **bi-monthly paychecks**, if their district opts in (SB 2424)
- Will receive procurement cards by the beginning of the school year (<u>SB 2422</u>)



- Will have licenses granted or renewed by the Mississippi Department of Education (MDE) within 21 days of MDE receiving their completed application (HB 1388)
- May be able to earn **supplemental endorsements** by passing a subject area (HB 1388)
- Will be able to **apply for license reciprocity** if they are licensed in another country (HB 1388)
- Will be able to more easily apply for an "Expert Citizen" teaching license and hold the license for longer (HB 1388)

Teacher Assistants



- Will receive a \$2,000 raise (<u>HB 530</u>)
- May receive bi-monthly paychecks, if their district opts in (<u>SB 2424</u>)

Students



 May take a new standardized career-readiness assessment (HB 1388)

Students with developmental disabilities



Will have **increased access** to university-based programs (<u>HB 881</u>)

Students in foster care



 Will be eligible for a new in-state postsecondary scholarship worth up to the cost of attendance (HB 1313)

Districts



- Will have **more discretion in setting course requirements** for students pursuing a career and technical education (CTE) pathway (<u>HB 1388</u>)
- Will have the option to pay employees on a bi-monthly basis (SB 2424)
- Will be able to **apply for interest-free loans** for facilities repairs and maintenance (SB 2430)
- Will have **student performance on a voluntary career-readiness assessment** count towards their accountability grade, as regulated by MDE (HB 1388)
